Remembering the life of....

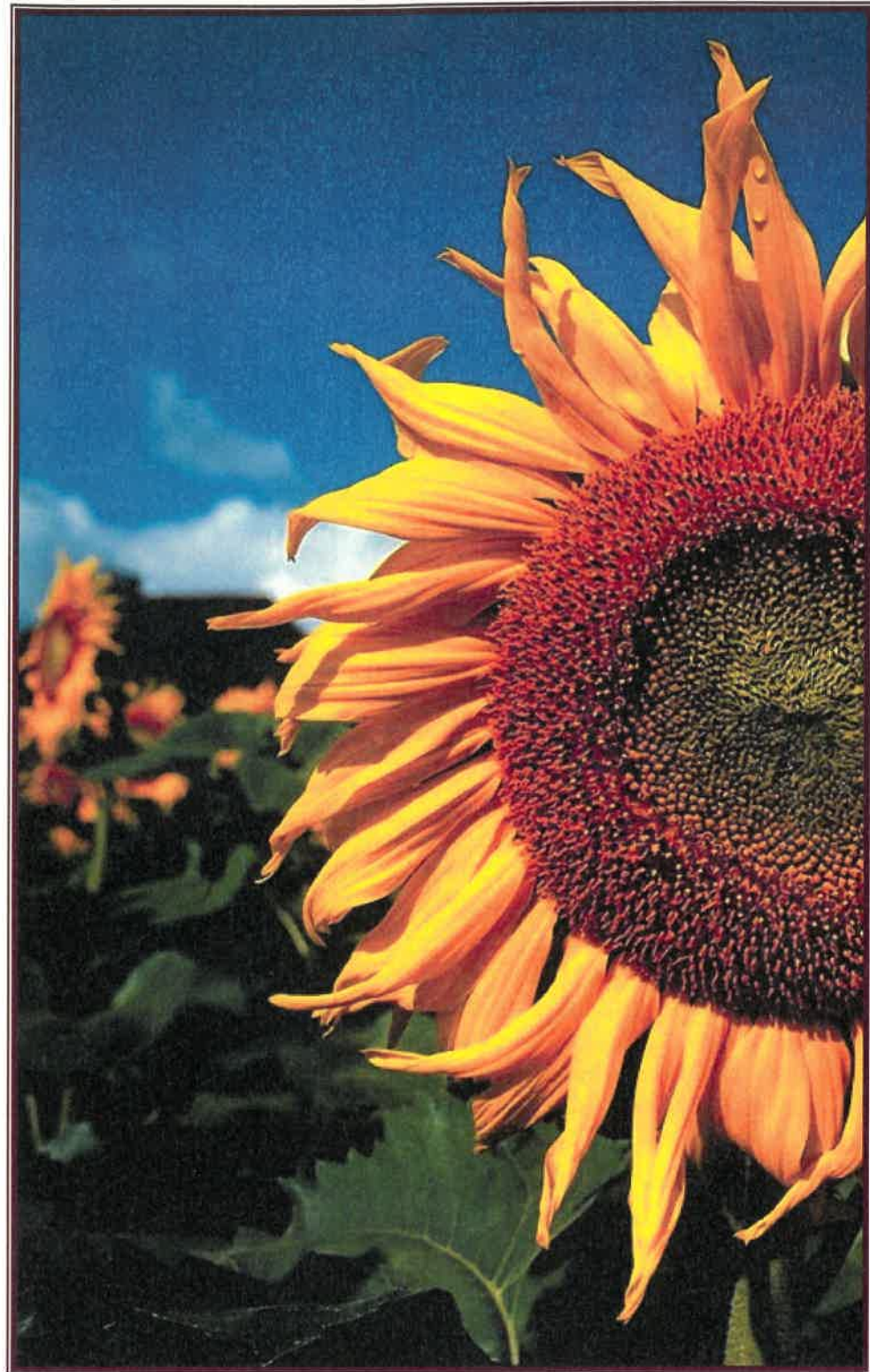
Courtney Jane Anderson, 31, of Fallbrook, CA, formerly of the Horace, ND area, passed away Saturday, May 9, 2020, at her home.
