Dermot Hochhalter, 78, West Fargo, ND died on Sunday, June 7, 2020 at his home surrounded by family and with Hospice of the RRV.

Dermot G. Hochhalter was born in Eureka, SD on January 2, 1942 to Theodore and Ida (Gehring) Hochhalter. Dermot grew up in Wishek, ND and attended Wishek Public School.
