

Remembering the life of....

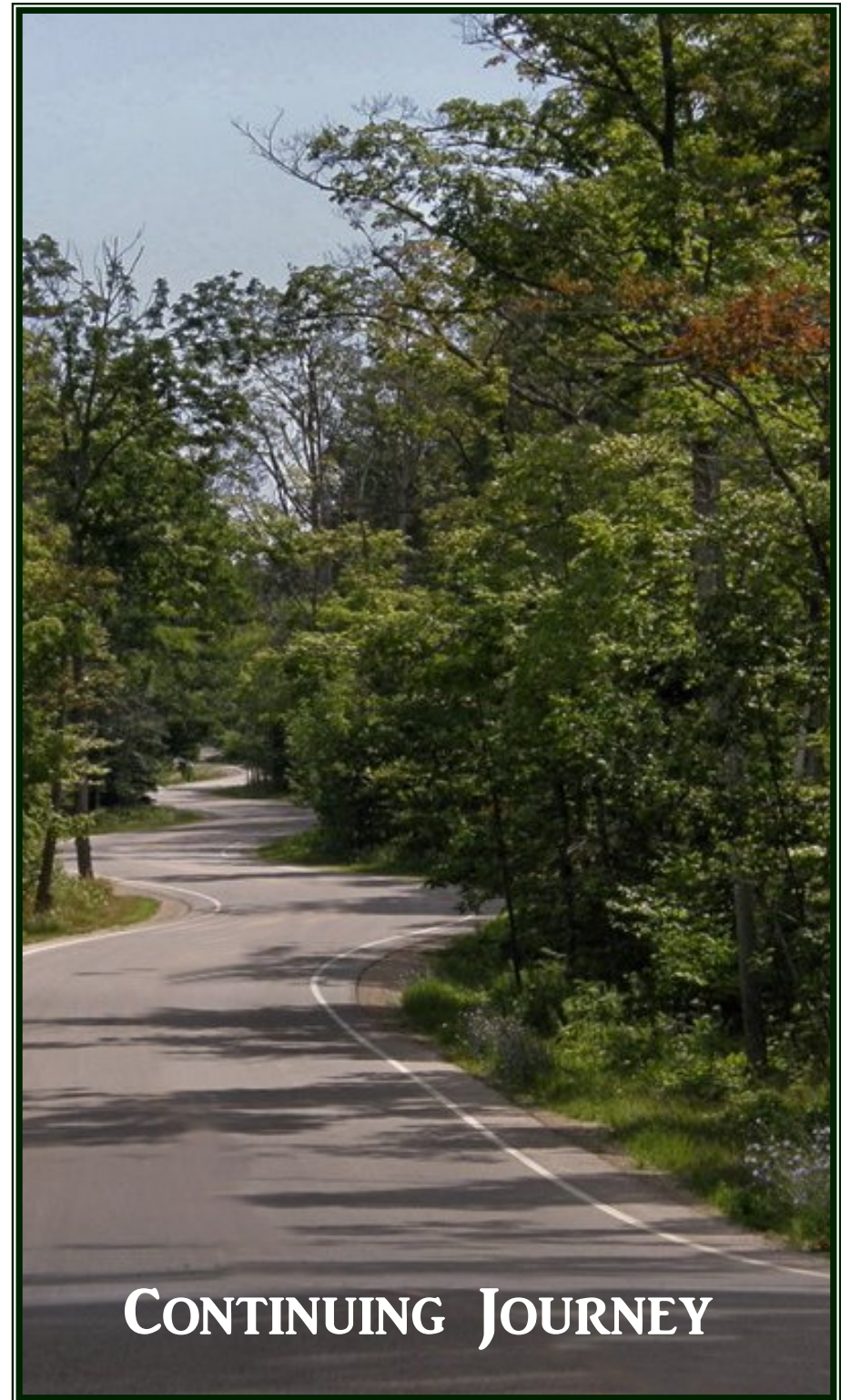
John Hansen, 91, Buffalo, ND died on Wednesday, Nov. 17, 2021 at the VA Medical Center in Fargo, ND.

John Grommesh Hansen was born on March 15, 1930 to John and Gertrude (Grommesh) Hansen at the family farm in Buffalo, ND. He was educated in the area and completed the 11th grade. On December 2, 1951 he entered the US Army and served in the Korean War, completing his tour of duty on November 17, 1953.
