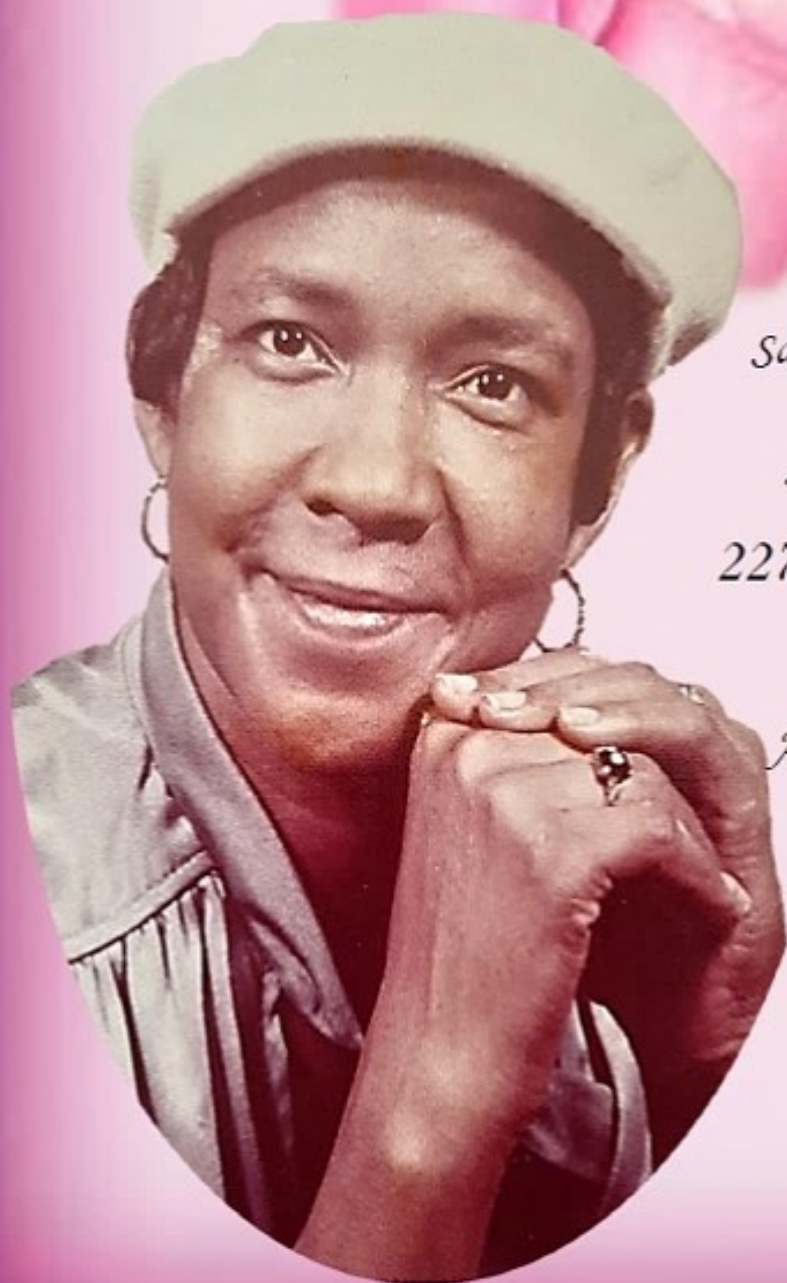

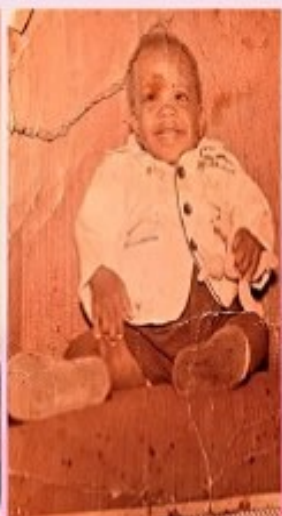

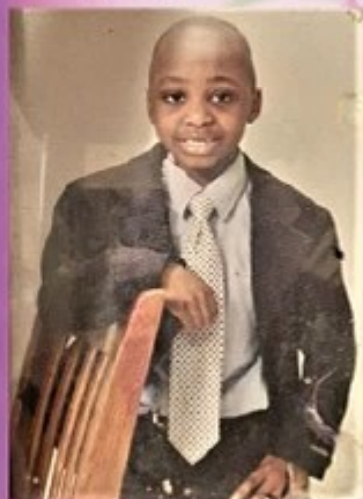

paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

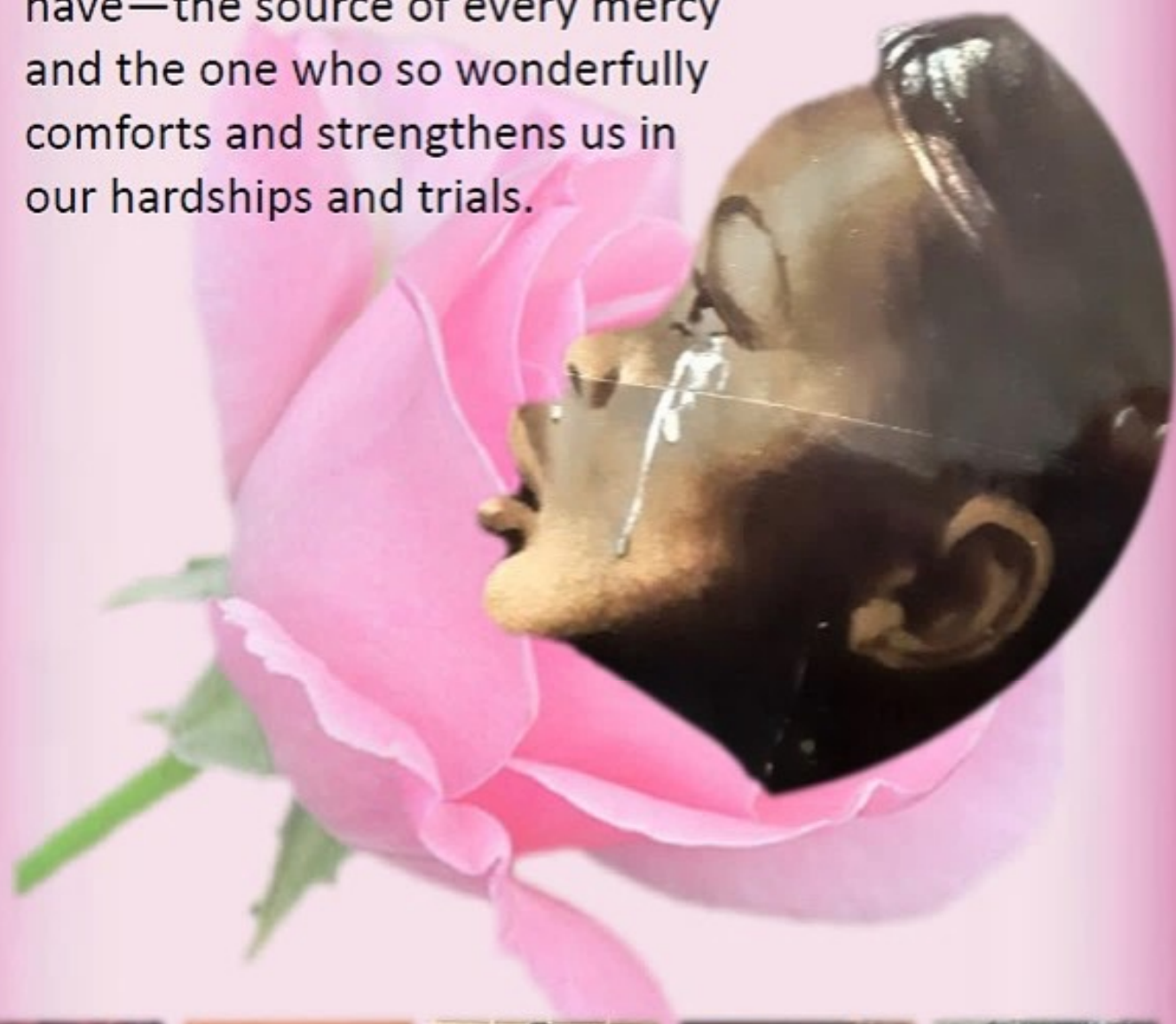
⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the
