Jack was baptized and confirmed at the Presbyterian Church in Storm Lake.

Growing up, Jack attended grade school and high school in Storm Lake where he graduated in 1947. He was employed with Paul Park Construction when in 1951, was called by Uncle Sam and enlisted on April 3, 1951 in the United States Army, to serve his country

during the Korean war.

He served Army 1st armored division Fort Hood, Texas and Fort Benning, Georgia, light and heavy weapons school. He was stationed overseas one year in Augsburg, Germany. He was honorably discharged on April 15, 1957.

Upon his return in 1953 he married and was blessed with four children: Debra Sue, Gregory James, April Jean, and Curtis K.

Jack was employed with Storm Lake Paint Store from 1953-1984 at which during that time took over as owner in 1969. He went out of business in 1984 and that same year married Deborah Molgaard August 23, 1984, where he gained a stepdaughter, Lisa Brus.


