It was often said when one failed the other was there to take care them. He went on to spend time running his own ceramic business from his home and to then started a bicycle repair business. He even taught himself to rebuild computers. He was always looking for a way to keep busy. The grandchildren all remember the treats of little debbies, sodas and candy that was shared by Grandpa with them and their friends.

Jack entered the nursing home in 2009 following the passing of the love of his life Sharon. He spent the remainder of his life watching the livestreams of his beloved Eagles and many other birds. Jack was known for having multiple bird feeders outside his window. He always made sure to watch out for all of the Pleasant View Nursing Home staff letting them know if they had a low tire or sharing his pizza with them. He had to be one of the few nursing home residents who had a scanner and multiple computers and at one time even a CB Radio! Jack had no true enemies thru out his life and was a friend to all. His best friend Virg would come and visit often and they shared many stories. Thru his life transitions and challenges Jack showed his true self as a proud, strong man, with courage and devotion who loved his family above all.
