Ronald Keith Nixon was born on October 4, 1956 in Adel, Georgia to the the union of the late Solomon Nixon, Sr. and the late Mattie Louise Deloach Nixon.

Ronald was previously married to the late Jamaine Anderson Nixon. To this union, one son, James Anderson Nixon was born.

At an early age Ronald accepted his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and joined Williams Chapel CME Church in Hawkinsville, Georgia. He served as Sunday School Superintendent and as an Usher. After moving to Tifton, he joined Everette Temple CME Church where he served in the following capacity until his illness: Trustee, Lay Organization, Usher and Assistant Church Secretary.

He was educated in the Cook County School System and the Pulaski County School System. Ronald was an all around youth participating in the band, football team and tennis team in his high school years. He graduated from Hawkinsville High School. He furthered his studies at Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College and Gupton-Jones College of Funeral Service where he graduated in 1978.

So on that day Ronald said, “I’m ready”. With those words he went home to be with his Savior Jesus Christ.
