THE OBITUARY

Mr. Franklin D. McRae was born on July 27, 1939 to the late Grady McRae, Sr. and Easter A. Floyd McRae. He transitioned from this life suddenly on August 6, 2017.

Mr. McRae attended Upchurch High School in Raeford, NC in 1958. Afterwards, he moved to Brooklyn, NY and shared quarters with his brother, Samuel McRae, while working for The Topps Company, Inc.

Mr. McRae joined Wall's Chapel Methodist Church at an early age. With his parent's guidance, that's where he learned to lean and depend on God. He was a member there until he moved away. Today, Mr. McRae's legacy lives on within Give A Chance Trucking, currently owned and operated by his eldest son, Franklin "Frankie" D. McRae.

In addition to spending time with his family, Mr. McRae spent his most joyous moments driving around

New Castle, DE in his pickup truck. He also enjoyed traveling to North Carolina to spend time with his siblings and their children. Mr. McRae's grandchildren fondest moments were traveling to North Carolina with him and listening to Sam Cooke's greatest hits on cassette throughout the journey, during which they would join in with their "PopPop" singing the lyrics to "A Change Gonna Come", "Chain Gang", "Cha-Cha" and many more.

Mr. Franklin D. McRae married Ms. Lorraine Jackson and to this union, three children were born.
