

THE LIFE OF A FAITHFUL SOLDIER

"Take with me your share of hardship, like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier in active service gets entangled in the affairs of civilian life; so that he may please the one who enlisted him to serve" – 2 Timothy 2:3-4

In the Red Clay Hills of Fitzgerald, Georgia, Reverend Jesse Lee Timmons was born to the late Willie Lee and Lucille Brooks Timmons on September 25, 1948. Surrounded by his loving family, Jesse entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, July 11, 2018. He was preceded in death by two brothers, James Smith and Marchman Holmes; two sisters, Mary Lou Holmes Harrison and Faustine Holmes; one nephew, Jimmy Holmes and one niece, Bridgett Timmons, his father-in-law, John Walter Melvin, and two sisters-in-law, Jacqueline McNeill and Autherine Timmons and two brothers-in-law, Clyde Freeman and Joseph Cole.

Jesse accepted Christ at a very early age. Throughout his military career, he served faithfully in various churches, but when he returned to North Carolina, he joined the Laurel Hill Missionary Baptist Church in 1974. At Laurel Hill, he was ordained as a deacon, and later, he was ordained as a Baptist preacher by The Union Baptist Association, Fayetteville, North Carolina. After retirement from pastoral ministry on December 31, 2016, Rev. Timmons joined the Mt. Pisgah Missionary Baptist Church, Raeford, North Carolina.

Rev. Timmons received his former education in the Ben Hill Public Schools (Fitzgerald, GA) before he was drafted into the United States Army. He served 22 years in the United States Army and retired from military service on June 1991 with the rank of First Sergeant. He is a graduate of Shaw University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion and Philosophy and a Master of Divinity degree from Campbell University Divinity School. He also spent several summers working with the Spirituality and Mental Health, Bridging the Gap Program in Asheville, North Carolina. Earlier in his educational studies, Jesse attended Carolina Bible College, Fayetteville, North Carolina where he received several certificates.

His ministerial experiences included fourteen years as pastor of the First Missionary Baptist Church, Chadbourn, North Carolina and eleven years as the pastor of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church, Laurinburg, North Carolina. His ministry also included a mission trip to Monrovia, Liberia in Africa where he conducted revivals and volunteered at various mission sites. He served as Moderator of the Pee Dee Missionary Baptist Educational Association, president of the Bladen and Columbus County Men's Union, vice-president of the Chadbourn Fellowship Alliance, president of the Usher Board in Berlin, Germany.



MY SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

I was born to Willie Lee and Lucille Brooks Timmons. My family was not a "attend church every Sunday" type of family. How did I become a preacher? This question can only be answered by the awesome power of God and his wonder-working power of the Holy Spirit.

As the seventh child of a family of ten, my family recognized that there was something "special" about my life. Even though I went through some dramatic experiences in my younger life, I can now reflect on how God used those experiences to shape and to mold my thinking, my actions and my character.

I was drafted into the United States Army, and God led me to Chaplain Bobby Bell and his lovely wife Betty at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. They became my mentors and until Chaplain Bell's death in 2006, he was my spiritual father, mentor, counselor and prayer warrior.

Another group that played a major role in my "calling" was The Navigators. The Navigators is an international, interdenominational Christian Ministry that helps people grow in Jesus Christ as they navigate through life. These young men were dedicated in helping me to be a committed disciple of Jesus Christ.

As I spent time witnessing to others, God placed in my life Albert Long and the Happenings, Inc. Ministry Team. Through this team, I was able to travel to different public schools, college campuses and churches in North Carolina, Tennessee, West Virginia and Florida. My greatest joy was sharing my testimony on how God had saved me and delivered me from a life of drugs.

Because of my duties in the United States Army, I was sent to Oklahoma for Drill Sergeant Duty. (This is the reason I thought I was there). In Lawton, Oklahoma during a revival, God called me to the gospel ministry. The uniqueness about my calling was it happened in a predominant Caucasian church. But God! When I returned home, I told my wife and my pastor, Reverend S.V. Melvin that God had called me to peach, and both of them said, "We knew that a long time ago. We were just waiting for you to announce it." On Father's Day, June, 1991, I preached my initial sermon at Laurel Hill Missionary Baptist Church, Lumber Bridge, North Carolina.


