During her youth, she joined Rockfish Grove FWB Church along with both parents and her uncle, James Buddy Harris, where they were all members until their death. This was her church home, she attended every Sunday and Saturday in her favorite seat... Everybody understood that Ms. Pearl sat in that third row seat every Sunday.

As a result of her many years of service to the church and her involvement with the Floral Ministry, she was honored as its oldest member with a plaque and picture that still dons the walls of the church today. She was a hard worker and like to get dressed up for church. She look forward to attending church on Sundays until her health began to fail.

She moved to Open Arms Nursing home in 2008 where she lived until her death in 2019. You will forever hold a special place in our hearts where there is nothing but love and admiration.

Others historical facts about Ms. Pearl's life included the fact that she started cooking career at the Raeford Hotel downtown. Few of them knew that Greyhound Bus stopped there and she

was the cook at the time. Folks came there to get a good meal because she could cook. This was the time of segregation in the south because whites and blacks sat on opposite sides of the eatery. There were no problems because everyone was there for the same reason "to get a good meal prepared by Ms. Pearl".

When the establish closed, she went to work at the Wagon Wheel Restaurant to further her career.

She was the first Afro American cook to work in that establishment where she earned the name "Cake Lady". When you came to visit her, she was always baking cakes for residents of the county. She will be truly missed, you see, nobody could bake a cake like Ms. Pearl. She was recognized in the local newspaper many years ago for her outstanding cake making skills.

Ms. Pearl is preceded in death by her parents, James and Irene Morrison of Raeford; her sister, Hattie Mae Morrison and four brothers, Jack, Lonnie, Earnest and Howard.

She leaves behind to cherish her memories: her sister, Mable King of Philadelphia, PA; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, friends, neighbors and in-laws.
