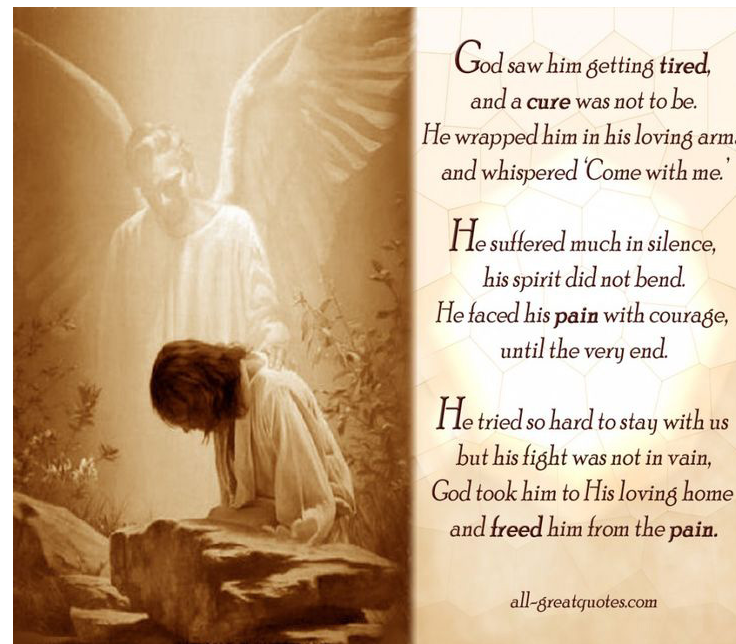
THE OBITUARY
