



After his second marriage to Glenda McRae, Marvin felt drawn to rejoin Wall's Chapel United Methodist Church located in Bowmore, NC where he effectively participated in the up keep of the church. There he served as Chairperson of the Trustee Board, sang on the Wall's Chapel Male Chorus, served as an Usher
