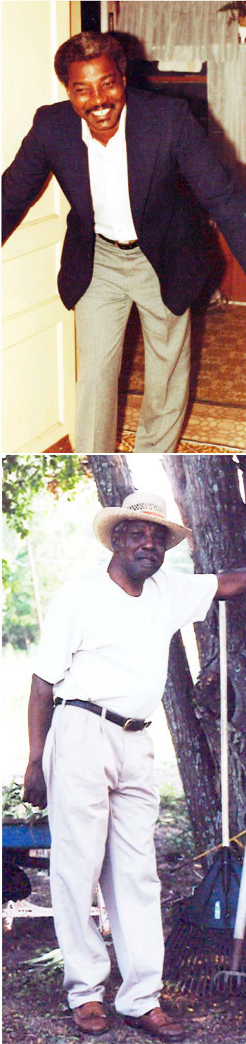

THE OBITUARY

Mr. Willie Prince Malloy Jr., affectionately known as “WP”, transitioned to be with our Lord on June 23, 2020 at the North Carolina State Veterans Home in Fayetteville, N.C. WP was born on February 16, 1939, to the late Willie Prince Malloy, Sr. and Lena McNair Malloy.

WP graduated from Upchurch High School in 1957 and then attended NC A&T University for 3 1/2 years majoring in Physical Education. WP resided in NY before entering the US Army in 1963 where his MOS was an army medic; he was honorably discharged three years later. After being discharged from the army, WP began his 35 year correctional officer career with the North Carolina Department of Corrections. During those 35 years, WP was also employed by the Hoke County school system as a bus driver and he was employed with North West Water System.

After his retirement in 2001, WP rejoined Spring Branch Missionary Baptist Church, where he served as a faithful member of the Trustee Board and grounds keeper until Alzheimer’s succeeded his memory.
