

The Obituary

Deacon Willie Russell McPhatter, Sr. was born in Hoke County, NC to the late Elder Raymond A. McPhatter and Mother Bertha Purcell McPhatter on January 23, 1945; and transitioned to his eternal home on May 23, 2021 in Raeford, NC surrounded by his children and grandchildren. Deacon McPhatter was also preceded in death by his wife, Carol Dean McGregor McPhatter and four siblings.

He was educated in the Hoke County School System and graduated from the historical Upchurch High School in Raeford, NC as a member of the Class of 1963. He will be remembered for his very calming demeanor, wisdom, faith, endurance, sense of humor, and he had his own way with words. His quiet, but powerful presence as a wonderful husband, father, grandfather, uncle, and friend made him to be an example of God's unwavering love, as he will be greatly missed by those who knew him.
