



## The Obituary

*Leon Valentino Ellison* was born on November 4, 1953, the oldest of three children born to Carie Mae Manning. He joined the Mt. Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, and was baptized in front of Gray's Creek MB Church in 1969. Leon was a young member of the Mt. Calvary Senior Choir along with his good friend, Spencer Shaw.

Upon graduating from Massey Hill High School (1972) where Leon was active in Chorus, Band, Football and Track. He enlisted in the U. S. Air Force and retired in 1992. He continued in service to his country as a Department of Defense civilian working in the Dragon Hill Lodge in Seoul Korea for another 27 years. Val, as he is known by his family, had always been a public servant. He served as well as the Commander of the VFW for all of Southeast Asia, which include Korea, Thailand and the Philippines. He departed this life on December 1, 2021, four days before his mother's birthday.

Leon's legacy consists of fifteen grandchildren and eighteen great grandchildren, as well as a host of nieces, nephews and cousins (who were like brothers and sisters).
