

APRIL 30, 1937 - JULY 8, 2019




oreen (Mom) was born in Red Deer, and was raised on the family homestead by Stauffer, Alberta.

The farm animals were her companions as an only child. She loved nature, horses especially her horse Nellie, the sheep, the cows, and the huge gardens that she helped her mother and grandparents keep. Fond

friends. Time at the cabin in Windermere was precious. Doreen never rested, always tending to the yard, trees and watering.

Alongside George, Doreen square danced, participated in the opening ceremonies of the 1988 Winter Olympics, volunteered at her church, and was always available to help with babysitting her grandchildren. Doreen was a gentle soul, giving, loving, quite natured, stoic, strong, and never complaining.
