Edward was a great cook, he loved fishing, watching his jeopardy and western movies especially the "Duke" John Wayne.

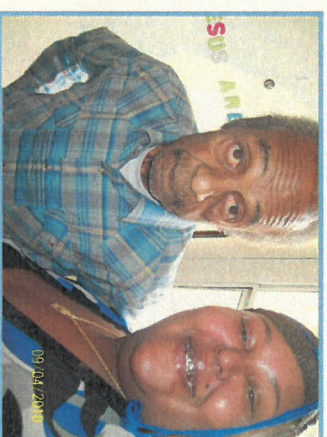
