Good friends, good times, a loved one's touch,

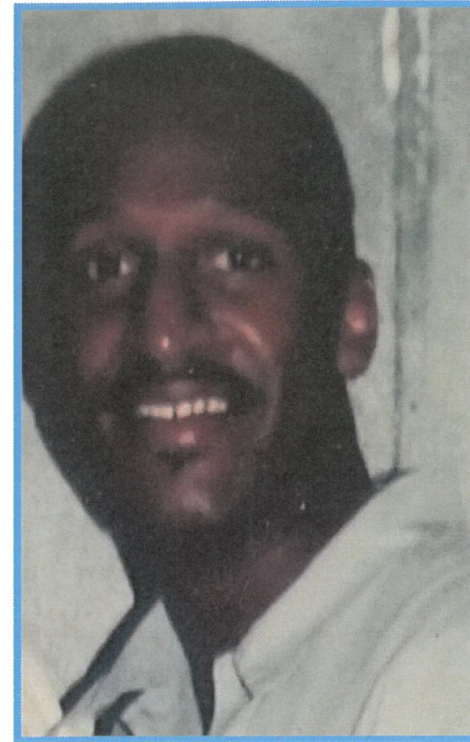
Perhaps my time seemed all too brief,
