MRS. MARY GOLDEN SUMPTER BURROUGHS, the daughter of the late John and Carrie Moore Sumpter, was born in Georgetown, SC on November 2, 1931. "Golden," as she was affectionately known, was the ninth of ten children.

"Golden" was educated in the Georgetown Public School System.

In her early 20s, "Golden" was united in Holy Matrimony to Ulysses Grant Burroughs of Bucksport, SC. Their beautiful union was blessed with one daughter. As a military wife, she truly supported her husband as he traveled the world serving in many tours with the United States Armed Forces (the Army, the Navy, and the Marine Corps). In February 1968, he passed away during the Vietnam War Conflict. Determined to persevere as she faced life's uncertainties without her husband by her side, "Golden" moved her family to Sanford NC to be closer to her family.
