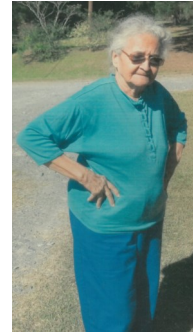

Obituary



Juanita Rushia McQueen Lassiter Jackson was born December 17, 1918 in Haw Branch, North Carolina. She was born to Mattie McQueen and Dude Martindale. She was raised by her grandmother, Ella McQueen.
