





She was married to the late James Willie "Mac" McLucas and to this union seven kids were born.

At an early age, Ollie made the decision to make Jesus her personal Savior. She united with Wall Street Baptist Church (now First Calvary Baptist Church) in Sanford where she was baptized and actively engaged in many ministries over the course of the years.

She was recently honored during the church's 139th year celebration.
