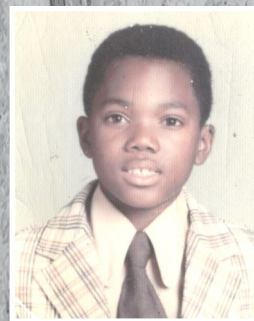
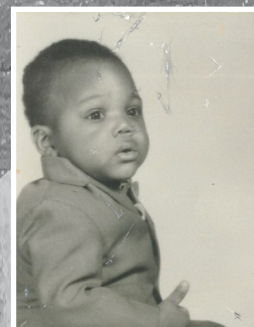

On Saturday, August 29, 2020 after a long battle of sickness, Clifford transitioned from his earthly life at First Health Hospital in Moore County, North Carolina.
