

Melvin was a proud veteran of the United States Army. He loved sharing stories and reminiscing about his time serving in the Army. Melvin worked at DCSC and worked for COTA as a bus driver. He also worked many years for the City of Columbus, Department of Engineering and Construction as an inspector before retiring in 2002.

Melvin accepted the Lord Jesus as his Savior and served faithfully at the Church of Christ of the Apostolic Faith as an ordained Elder, President of the Brotherhood, Deacon, and Sunday School teacher. He was passionate about seeking God and teaching the truth. He enjoyed traveling, reading, and studying the Bible.
