



I never saw you portraited as another woman, your daughters carry your trait, feeling like ok Terrell time to wake up, wish I could have traded places.


Never seen that look on their faces, agonizing expressions overran by tears like the dam broke. Man, I never heard my mom that hurt before, make me appreciate you.
