Timothy Patrick O’Brian Moses Jr. was born on November 3, 1992, in Laurens County, South Carolina, to Timothy “Pat” (Emily) Moses, Sr. and Natasha (Bryant) Cheek.

A Life Well Spent...

Tim, or “PJ” as he was affectionately known, attended the public schools of Laurens County, South Carolina and was a graduate of the Laurens District 55 High School Class of 2011. He excelled in academics, was a die-hard Clemson Tigers fan, and thoroughly enjoyed his time during Clemson Football games. In 2015, he earned his Bachelor’s degree in Bioengineering from Clemson University and in 2017, Tim completed Duke University’s Master degree program in Biomedical Engineering. Upon his graduation in 2017, Tim moved to Boston, Massachusetts where he joined the Johnson and Johnson “J&J” Research & Development “R&D” Leadership Development Program.

While matriculating at Clemson, Tim was a member of the National Society of Black Engineers. He continued to pay it forward in his professional career and served as the J&J Vision Care R&D Internship Lead as well as spearheaded the R&D Intern Mentorship Program.
