A MOTHER'S LOVE

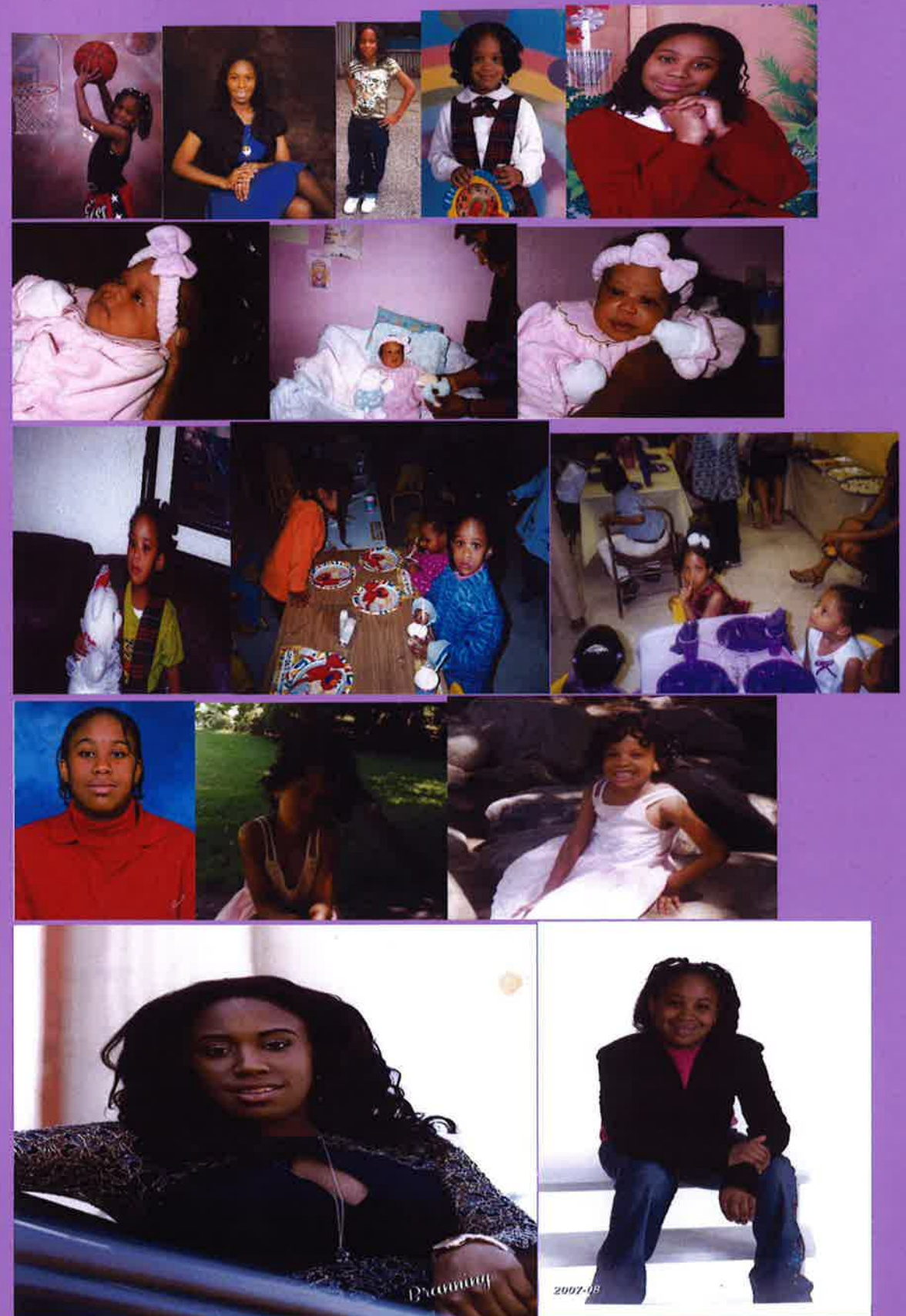
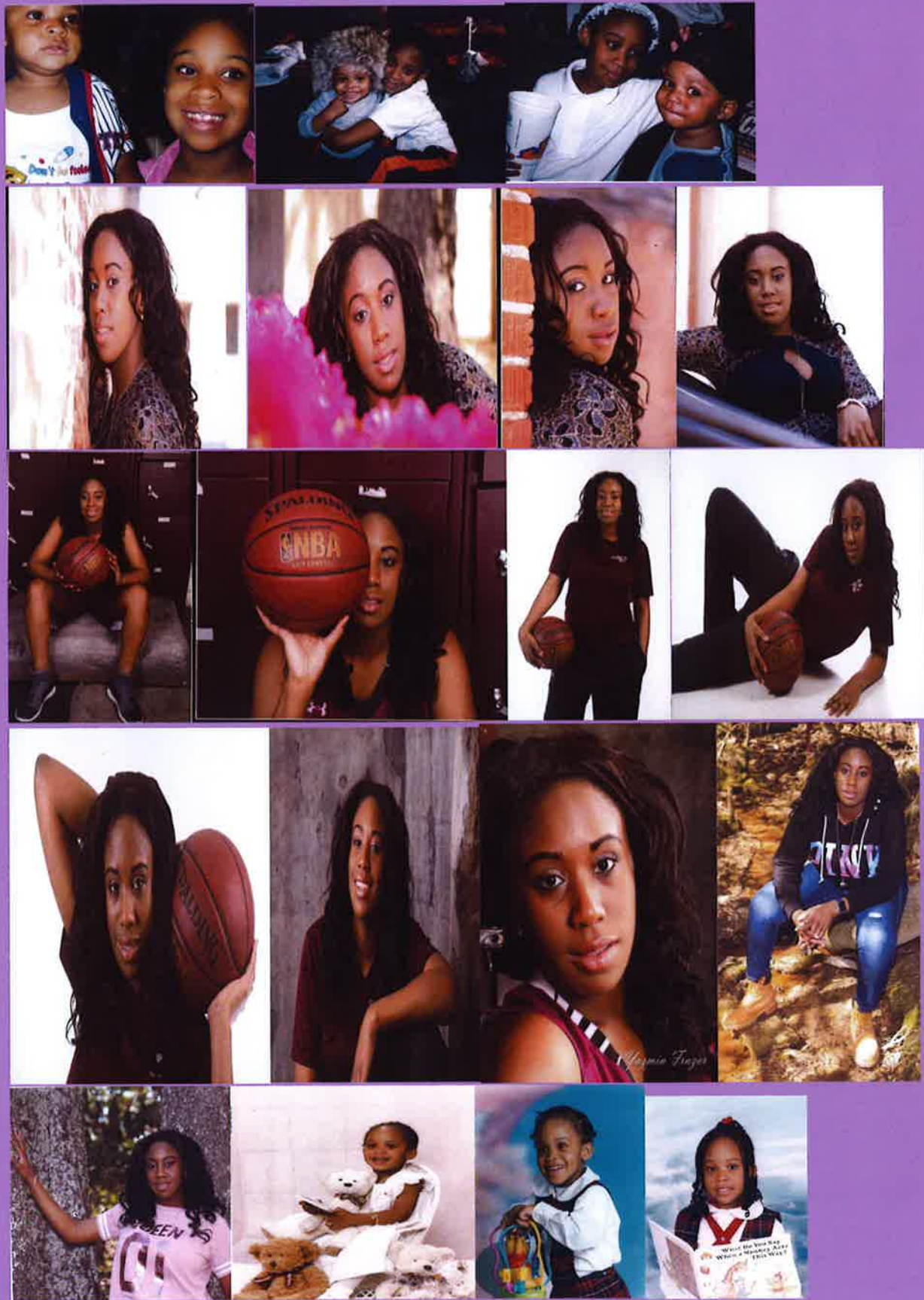
