Bink's Obituary

Mrs. Bink Cason Martin was born February 28, 1930 at Sunny Hill Plantation in Tallahassee, Florida to the late Allie Cason and Mattie Tucker. She departed this earthly life May 23, 2017 in the loving comfort and care of her children. Bink was the youngest of thirteen siblings (Al Cason, Harry Cason, Henry Cason, Gene Caison, Noble Nash, Elmer Cason, Christoria Livingston, Eva Cason, Estella Atkinson, Bertie Rochelle, Addie Cason and Leslie Mae Cason. All preceded her in death.)

Bink received her early education from Brown Cherry School, Tallahassee, Florida and graduated from Oakland High School Tallahassee, Florida. Thereafter, she attended Florida A&M University earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. From that time forward, Mrs. Martin dedicated her career and life to the care of others. She served in numerous capacities as a health practitioner. However, Bink's last years of service were rendered as a recovery room nurse. She retired from University Hospital (Shands Jacksonville, now known as UF Health) December 12, 1991 after 32 years of service and a standing membership in Chi Eta Phi Nursing Sorority.

Bink married the late Robert F. Martin on November 9, 1957. Two children were born to this union, Robert C. Martin and Myra Jo Martin. Valerie Wooten, an older daughter, was born prior to this marriage.

Mrs. Martin professed Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age. She was an active member of Bethel Baptist Institutional Church. While in attendance, she served on the Usher Board and routinely supported the Tuesday Prayer Group until her health declined. In 2014, Bink relocated to Miramar, Florida.
