Life Reflections

Mrs. Hattie L. McKissick departed this life on Monday, May 20, 2019. Mrs. McKissick was born on May 25, 1918, in Jacksonville where she spent her formative years. She received her education in the Duval County School system, graduating from Stanton High School in 1937. Mrs. McKissick went on to matriculate at Talladega College, graduating from there in 1941. While there, she pledged the Chi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., in the year 1938. She later became a part of the Gamma Rho Omega Chapter of Jacksonville, FL, serving for a time as the Tamiochus of the chapter.

In 1945, Mrs. McKissick left for New York City after marrying the love of her life, Mr. Lawrence McKissick in 1942. While living in New York, she worked for the New York School System up until her retirement. After the death of her husband, Lawrence in 2002, Hattie returned to Jacksonville in 2003 to live out the rest of her days with her family and friends. Among her many enjoyments, Hattie was an avid traveler, taking multiple cruises annually to many places across the globe.
