Miss me-but let me go

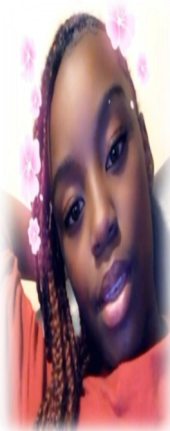
For this is a journey that we all must
