She showered her grandchildren with bags every paycheck filled with candy and snacks. Along with those bags was her saying "I love you". **Veronia** was always there for her children, grandkids, family, church, friends and neighbors. Her door was always open and never required a phone call ahead. **Veronia** raised her granddaughter, Jennifer Taylor as her own. And was a best friend to her granddaughter, Adrienne Patterson Harris.

Women like **Veronia Taylor** are the root of many greater attributes that are shown through their children and the lives they've touched, as well as the generation here now and still to come. The women who have worked in kitchens, scrubbed floors, and have been caretakers to so many.
