

Thomas Dewey Copeland was born on January 28, 1949 in Anniston, Alabama. He received a loving embrace and was taken into the bosom of our Lord and Savior on February 4, 2021 at the age of 72.

He was eternally proud of the fact that he was the product of the Black Community and knew that instilling Black Pride in younger generations was key to progress.

Thomas' professional experience included several entrepreneurial endeavors over the years as well as his body of work in technology and architectural design. His resume included years of outstanding service with the Powell Valve and Lukenheimer Valve Companies. After many years of succeeding as a building architect, he retired from the Building Technologies Division of Armco Steel and to this day, steel building structures that he helped to design remain in production.

In 1969, Thomas married his high school sweetheart, Joyce Yvonne Moon. She was the absolute love of his life, and together they celebrated 53 years of matrimony on this very day — February 14th. God richly blessed their union with two children, his one-and-only son, Ty, and his devoted baby girl, Ericka.

Thomas loved spending time with his wife, children and grandchildren. He valued his family and they were the priority and focus of his life. Thomas spent a lot of time grooming his children and grands to have a strong

sense of pride, to embrace their culture and history, to extend love and kindness to all, and to serve others. His legacy is in good hands!
