

## Obituary for Dr. James Howard Campbell

Dr. James Howard Campbell was born on April 27, 1972 in Cincinnati, Ohio. He was the youngest of two children born to Arimel Campbell and James Howard Brown. James, affectionately known to his family and close friends as "Slap", was very inquisitive and intelligent from an early age. He was also a foodie who loved cookies and hamburgers. He was a Cub Scout during his elementary years and held his Scoutmaster in high esteem.

As a young man, he was quite the athlete. James would spend time playing different sports in his neighborhood. He was always described as smart and that proved to certainly be true throughout his life. He attended pre-school at Scheil Elementary, where he was a part of the Bi-Lingual English and Spanish Program. He attended Pleasant Ridge Elementary and Cincinnati Bi-Lingual Academy (C.B.A.). Those early educational institutions provided his education and understanding of Spanish as a second language.
