

Empress Evangelist Eva Lois Moats

Eva Lois Daniels-Moats was born on July 11th in the year of 1941, to her Parents, Mary Lue and Mr. Shellie Daniels, in Cordell, GA. At the age of five, the family moved to Macon, GA. She graduated from Appling High School, in Macon, GA. She was one of 15 children and has been preceded in death by all except two birthed Sisters, Ms. Mildred Nelloms and Mrs. Lucille Moody, and Adopted Sister, Rhonda Daniels.

She moved to Cincinnati, OH at the age of 19 and was introduced to Zion Temple First Pentecostal Church by her Cincinnati Cousins, The King Family, where she joined, was Baptized In Jesus Name, Accepted and was Filled with The Indwelling of the Precious Gift of the Holy Spirit and became a member, under the late Bishop Jasper Phillips.

Soon after, Evangelist Eva Moats was introduced to and married Deacon James Alvin Moats. They were Married on March 30th, 1963. From there she moved her Church Membership to Bethlehem Temple Apostolic Church, under the late Bishop Elzie W. Young and then later Bishop Dr. Johnnie L. Johnson, for a total of over 40 Years of Dedicated Fellowship, Membership and contribution to the Saints.

To date, Evangelist Eva, along with Deacon Moats, have been Faithful Members of Mt. Olive Apostolic Church for over 10 Years, under the leadership of Pastor Richard and Norma Behanan, who are additionally Her Spiritual Brother and Sister, with nearly 50 Years of Godly Covenant Friendship and fidelity.

Evangelist Eva Moats was an avid natural scholar, wordsmith and intellectual. She attended the Ohio Institute of Nursing and received her LPN Certification (Nursing), and later completed a ministry training program through New Life Institute and earned her Master of Divinity degree.

God called Evangelist Eva to a personal evangelistic ministry regionally and nationwide. Evangelist Moats would Minister to everyone She encountered, from the Corner Stop to the Bus Stop, to the everyday Man and Woman, to the 'Churched' and People in Elected Offices...Evangelist Moats was widely known, respected, revered and loved, for Her Compassion, Godly Wisdom, Instruction and most importantly, Her Motherly Love.

Evangelist Eva loved to Minister in Song and Psalms, as She was a Soloist and sang in the 'Radio Choir', 'The Morning Choir' and special groups over the years at Bethlehem Temple Church and beyond, and later at Mt. Olive Apostolic Church. She wrote for the national publication, "The Voice In The Wilderness" for the PCAF (Pentecostal Churches Of The Apostolic Faith) for many years, and was a writer of countless inspirational poems for special events. She was a Sunday School Teacher, a licensed Day Care Provider, a faithful member of the Sick Visitation Committee, and additionally had an extensive Radio Broadcasting Ministry for over 30+ Years on Cincinnati Radio Stations 1050 AM, 1320 AM and 93.3 FM.

Evangelist Moats' Life was full of Faith, Family, Ministry and Love. Evangelist Eva Moats' joy was in Jesus and steadfastly looked for His appearing, compelling many to do the same, as apart of the Tarrying and Street Evangelism Ministries.

Deacon James and Evangelist Eva Moats were known as the 'Patriarch and Matriarch' of Both Sides of their Families, for their Spiritual Wisdom and Life Leadership. Together, they birthed and became the parents of Six Children in their Marital Union: Maria, Damon, Margarethe, Adrian (preceded them in death), Abigail and Rebecca Moats. James was the father to one other daughter prior to their Union, Sheri Bostic, and as a result, Evangelist Eva became an 'Instant Bonus-Mother' and loved Sheri, who additionally gave Her a Bonus Granddaughter, Ebonie Bostic and Great-Granddaughter, Honestee Cheatham and her Brother, Courtier Stephens. This is in addition to Deacon James and Evangelist Eva being Grandparents to two Granddaughters, Dionna Roberson Massey and Taylor Roberson, and Great-Grandparents to three Great-Grandchildren, Xavier Young, Jr., Amora Jones and Adrianna Massey; and Two Son-In-Loves, Doug Roberson and Darrius Massey.

Evangelist Eva had a loving Mother-In-Love, the late, great, Dorothy Moats.
