



Robert Taylor, also known as "Rob" was born on September 21, 1958, in Cincinnati, Ohio. Robert was born to the union of James Taylor, Sr. and Helen Gray (Taylor). He was the third oldest of 11 children from this union.

Robert attended Washburn Elementary School and Porter Junior High School in Cincinnati, Ohio. As a child, Robert enjoyed playing basketball, baseball and jumping fences.
