## Obituary

Bettie J. Thomas was born on January 12, 1938 in Montgomery, Alabama. She was the second child born to the union of David Nathan and Laura Louise Porter. Bettie peacefully departed this earth on Saturday, July 25, 2020, reuniting in heaven with her beloved husband of 36 years, Benny.

In 1940, following the birth of her brother, Thomas (Tommy) Porter, the family would relocate to Cincinnati, Ohio. Bettie and Tommy would return to Montgomery regularly in the summers where they both learned to read at a very early age at Miss Bell's Nursery School.
