

# *The Obituary*

**Curt Davis, Sr.** was born on October 2, 1940 in Cincinnati, Ohio to the parents of the late Lee and Zora Bell Davis.

You could also hear them performing "Live" every Sunday morning over the airwaves of Radio Station WCIN 1480 on your AM dial. Curt was a Butcher for E. Kahns & Sons. His hobbies included cooking and exercising at the Melrose YMCA located in Walnut Hills, Ohio.

Zora Bell Davis; two sisters, Shirley Davis and Zora Bell James; and daughter, Edith Carter.
