Obituary

ALPHONZO STARKEY was born to the late Mary Ruth Harris and Mose Starkey on February 16, 1944 in Cincinnati, OH. He was called home to Jesus on October 2, 2020.

He confessed his life to Christ at an early age at Bethlehem Baptist Church in downtown Cincinnati. He was educated in the Cincinnati Public Schools. He served honorably in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. He worked for the Ford Motor Co., but his passion in life started when he was introduced to cosmetology and barbering.
