Thelma's Candied Sweet Potatoes

6-8 Sweet Potatoes

1 Stick of Butter

6 C. Sugar

1 T. Black Pepper or More

1 ½ C. Water

(according to taste)

Boil potatoes until almost done. Peel and slice into 13 x 9 inch tin foil pan. Do not use glass. Mix sugar and water in saucepan. Boil until clear. Dot potatoes with butter. Sprinkle with black pepper. Pour syrup over potatoes and cook in 400 degree oven on lower rack for 2 ½ hours or until syrup is thick, candy and potatoes are translucent. Baste often.
