
## The Family Free

Victoria, affectionately known as "Torri," was employed by Johnson Food Service at Fort Jackson and was an employee at Horizon Daycare at Palmetto Health.


Victoria was a loving, caring, and kind hearted person who had a vibrant spirit. Her smile and laugh was enough to always brighten anyone's day.
