Lillie Mae Fletcher departed her life's journey after a very courageous battle with the dreadful Covid-19 virus on January 23rd 2021. She was born June 19, 1932 to Branch and Lillie Robinson. Lillie Mae's mother passed away at an early age. It was at that time that her God Parents Isaac & Francis Robinson stepped in and raised her as their own.

Lillie Mae was a member of True Honor Missionary Baptist Church in Clute, TX all of her young life. She later met and married Roscoe Campbell II in 1949. Together they birthed three children ~ Isabell Helms, Roscoe Isaac Campbell, and Robert Lynn Campbell Sr.

Lillie Mae was always a beautiful woman with a love for hair and fashion. This passion motivated her to attend beauty college/cosmetology school and she became a beautician. She lived the word beauty as it is defined... a combination of qualities that pleases the aesthetic senses, especially the sight. Lillie Mae was deeper than the beauty you visually saw. She embodied the ability to uplift, show gentleness, courage, resilience, honesty and bravery. She allowed her intuition to guide her. She had an enormous heart. Lillie Mae always greeted everyone with love, which would explain how she became everyone's Mama, Bigmama, Auntie, and Sister.

Lillie Mae later met Rev. H.H. Fletcher, when he Pastored True Honor Missionary Baptist. The two were married on August 18, 1973. They later moved on to Eastern Branch Missionary Baptist Church in Freeport, TX and then in 1975 Rev. H.H. Fletcher & Lillie Mae Fletcher founded the Second Missionary Baptist Church in Freeport TX. She worshipped and built a strong foundation with her husband at Second Baptist until his passing on June 29th, 2003. Lillie Mae faithfully continued her ministry work at Second Baptist until her death.

Over the years, Lillie Mae shared of herself as a leader, an encourager, and a role model. She uplifted many during her life's spiritual journey. Her teachings inspired, motivated, and empowered others. Therefore, we remember her today as a legend and an "ICON". We cannot forget the Beauty Shop/Boutique. There were multiple locations, Fletchers House of Beauty and Fletcher's Hair and Shears, to name two, all filled with love. There was always enjoyment in "the shop." You would find Rev playing gospel music, the ladies embroiled in conversation, the sons ~ Roscoe and Robert stopping by, and the grandkids all crowding around to get their kiss from Bigmama. The Beauty Shop was the spot to be. The customers and visitors loved to partake of the ambiance, from the coffee to the small pies and the cookies she and daughter Isabell would have baked, it promised to be an uplifting experience. No matter what was available, on any given day, it was all eaten. Now for those hot curling irons, stay away because they were hot, and that back room you did not want to have to go back there, because if you did, you knew you were in trouble.

Some of her favorite sayings included:

"Have a blessed day!"

"Stop moving it's hot!"

"Know who you are and who's you are!"

"We're not rich but we dress like we are!"

And the one that sticks in all our minds,

"Do it decent and in order."
