
## **Marvin Joseph Dequaine**

Marvin Joseph Dequaine, 79, of Algoma, passed away with his family by his side at Aurora Hospital on Wednesday, September 9, 2015 after a courageous 19 year battle with MDS. Marvin was very proud to have served his country in the United States Army in Korea.
