And whispered, "Come with me."

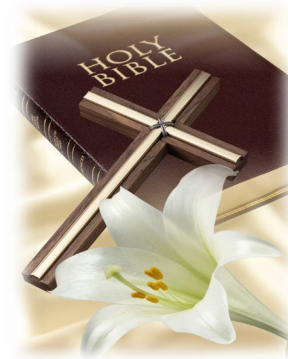
You didn't deserve what you went

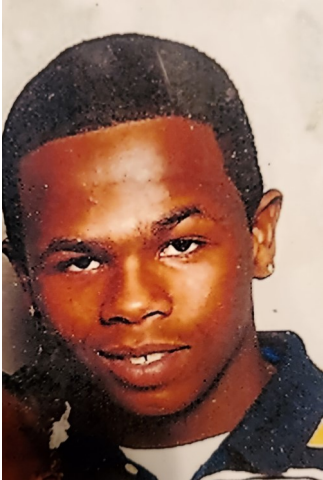
