

Obituary Mr. Burnice Sylvester Bittle



Burnice Sylvester Bittle was born on May 26, 1938, in Chesterfield County, South Carolina. He departed this life on Sunday, December 26, 2021. **Burnice** was the beloved son of the late Eugene and Allie Lee Bittle.

Throughout his primary years, **Burnice** attended the public school system of Chesterfield, South Carolina. Following high school he served as a Military Police, foreign and domestic, for three years, including a one-year tour of duty in Korea.

Burnice studied Business and Electronics after leaving the military where he built a small television set before his completion of

the course. He later worked for the Swift Meat Packaging Company where he received the opportunity to train for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety Inspection Service. **Burnice** was one of the few African Americans, during the 1960s, to serve as a Federal Inspector. He retired this position after thirty-two years of service.

For several more years **Burnice** worked in an industrial corporation as a Site Manager with Cronatron Welding Systems, Inc. He spent his remaining years working for the Lord as the Head Deacon at the Northeast Seventh-Day Church in Charlotte, North Carolina.

In addition to his parents, **Burnice** was preceded in death by his dear sister, Doris Cummings, and four brothers, David Bittle, Burise Bittle Sr., Thurmond Bittle, and Lester Bittle.
