

Obituary

Marjorie Dean Hunter was born July 25, 1977 in Jacksonville, NC. She is the baby girl of Ellis Hunter, Jr. and Lola Dupree Hunter. She attended primary through high school in Farmville, NC where she was a student athlete. She graduated in 1995 from Farmville Central High School.

Marjorie joined the United States Navy just days after graduating high school on July 19, 1995. She graduated from Recruit Training Command in Great Lakes, Illinois on October 20, 1995. Her first duty station was in San Diego, CA where she climbed the ranks from Seaman Recruit to Storekeeper Third Class (SK3). SK3 Hunter reported to USS FRANK CABLE in September 1998 and served there until April 2003. During her tenure aboard USS FRANK CABLE, she was promoted to Storekeeper Petty Officer Second Class (SK2) and earned Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist (ESWS). In May 2003, SK2 Hunter reported to her first shore duty at Naval Hospital Pensacola (Florida). Her duties consisted of supply management for 22 wards and clinics as a Supply Technician. In June 2006, SK2 Hunter reported to her second ship onboard USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT as the Main I/II Leading Petty Officer. Six months after reporting, she was advanced to Storekeeper First Class (SK1) and earned her Enlisted Aviation Warfare Specialist. In June 2014, SK1 Hunter reported to Strike Fighter Weapons School Atlantic. Within the first few months onboard, she achieved the greatest milestone of her career by advancing to the ranks of Chief Petty Officer. In July 2017, Chief Hunter reported to shore duty at Training Support Center Hampton Roads. Her personal awards include three Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, three Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, and multiple unit and service awards, including five Good Conduct Medals.

Marjorie was a dedicated mother of two boys Kaiden (13) and Jody (9). Marjorie was the epitome of a Super-Mom. While managing her military career, education, and friendships, she was able to keep the boys active in sports and community events.

Marjorie was preceded in death by her paternal grandmother, Roberta Mercer Hunter and brother, Ellis Hunter III.
