She was born in Whiteville, North Carolina on April 2, 1942 to the late Gertrude L and Willie A Hill. She was also preceded in death by her two sisters, Myrtle L. Martin and Barbara Ann Hill, her two brothers, John Willie Hill and Oree Hill, and great grand daughter, Nija Lacey.

Nancy received her early education and graduated from Central High School in 1960, she then attended Fayetteville Teachers College in Fayetteville, North Carolina.

During her twenties, Nancy lived in Philadelphia, Pa where she worked for the United States Postal Service. After the death of her mother in July 1971, she returned to Whiteville and continued her career and retired from the Brunswick post office as Postmaster in September 1992.

Politics has always been a passion for Nancy. She was involved in many grass roots and civil rights organizations, steering committees and boards to improve the lives of the people within her community. Nancy served as President of Columbus Group Home Inc. and Farmers Union Developmental Daycare Center and a member of the Columbus County Leadership Council. Nancy also served as President of the Arc of Columbus County and member of Southeastern Community College Foundation Board, Chairwoman of Columbus County Intergovernmental Council. In 1989 Nancy was elected as Commissioner for the town of Brunswick and served as Mayor from 2009-2021.

A woman of God, Nancy was a baptized believer and grew up in the Cherry Grove Missionary Baptist Church where she served as an usher, Sunday school teacher, member of the adult choir, missionary circle and hospitality committee for over 50 years. She is currently a member of the Welches Creek Baptist Church.
