Obituary

Pauline Jessica (Harris) Samuel Singletary was born in Florence, South Carolina to Rebecca Williams and Harry Harris on May 4, 1930; she was the youngest of four children. She was called home on Sunday, August 28, 2022.

Pauline and her sister, Osroe, moved to Buckhead, Georgia where they were raised by their paternal grandmother until the age of six before returning to live with their mother in Chadbourn, North Carolina. Pauline attended Chadbourn Primary School and graduated from Chadbourn High School in 1948 (later Westside High).
