Life's Brief

Lloyd and Gertrude Register were overjoyed on August 22, 1943 with the birth of a beautiful baby girl, Jollye Jane in the Hallsboro community of Columbus County, North Carolina. On January 10, 2023, just as the mid afternoon hours approached, Jollye performed her last Carpool Karaoke singing That Other Shore, and praised her way into eternal rest at Novant Medical Center in Wilmington, North Carolina.

She loved the Lord and accepted Christ at a young age, where she attended Mt. Hebron AMEZ Church in Hallsboro, NC.

She attended Columbus County Schools and graduated from Artesia High School in 1961. Even as a child, Jollye was bright, brilliant and smart! She was a leader among her classmates and friends and loved telling others what to do and how to do! With a heart and a gift for teaching, she left her small town to further her education at Elizabeth City State Teachers College in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. Being a social butterfly, and people person, she quickly became active in the college community. She pledged Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority in the Fall of 1962. She loved her line sisters and kept in close contact with them over the years.

After graduating from college, Jollye moved back home and met a handsome gentleman, who was very smitten with her, the late Hubert Jesse Shaw. The two were a match made in Heaven and married on December 24, 1964. As a young married couple, the two took great care of their parents. Even after moving into their own beautiful home, they were diligent in ensuring that the needs of their parents were met. The family became members of Mt. Pleasant AME Zion Church, where she diligently served in any capacity and wherever she was needed. She served on the Usher Board, was a Sunday School Teacher and most recently was the chairperson of the Board of Trustees. Even after their two daughters, Connie and Melanie were born, they continued living, loving, working in the church and farming. Jollye loved her community! She was a giver and could always be found helping others. She would call her neighbors and friends to see if anybody needed anything. She was a phenomenal cook and would fix meals and her signature, delectable pound cakes and carry them around the neighborhood. What she seemed to enjoy the most, however, was teaching and guiding her girls, students and mentees how to live, do business and how to treat others.

Jollye was an amazing teacher and business woman! Upon returning home she started her teaching career at West Columbus High. She would often laugh about how her beloved Hubert would give her \$20 each week and it was enough for gas, lunch and milk and diapers for baby Connie. She furthered her career as the Keyboarding Teacher at Armour High School, Acme-Delco Jr., Sr. High School and East Columbus High School. She became affectionately known in the schools by her nicknames, Mrs. ASDFJKL; and Mrs. FBLA. Jollye was a leading lady! She knew how to get the job done and if she couldn't get it done, she would call on others who would get it done for her! She would lead fundraisers for her students to take trips with the FBLA, and many of them won competitions locally and nationally during her tenure as their leader. She was well known and well loved by her many students. In her last days, former students sent tributes of how her stern love and teaching molded them into the adults they are today. Her love for the young and the community led her to become a proud member of the Whiteville Chapter of Las Amigas, Inc. where she served for 50 years. She mentored many young ladies and each year raised large sums for the Las Amigas Scholarship pageant. Local business owners knew and respected her, and did not mind sowing into her fundraising initiatives.

Jollye was a planner, and a great writer! She was a stickler for everything being grammatically correct. She also loved reading. She penned the programs and obituaries for many in the community, along with her close friend, the late Connie Jacobs. It was a joke among her family that she volunteered to do the programs so that she could pencil herself in to read the acknowledgments! She was such a planner that she planned and made the layout for her own service and even wrote in how the service was to be handled in case of the pandemic!

Jollye had no fear of death and was at total peace before her passing. In her own words, "I have been blessed to live a good life and I have no complaints." She will forever be remembered for her legacy of love, working hard, sharing and helping others.

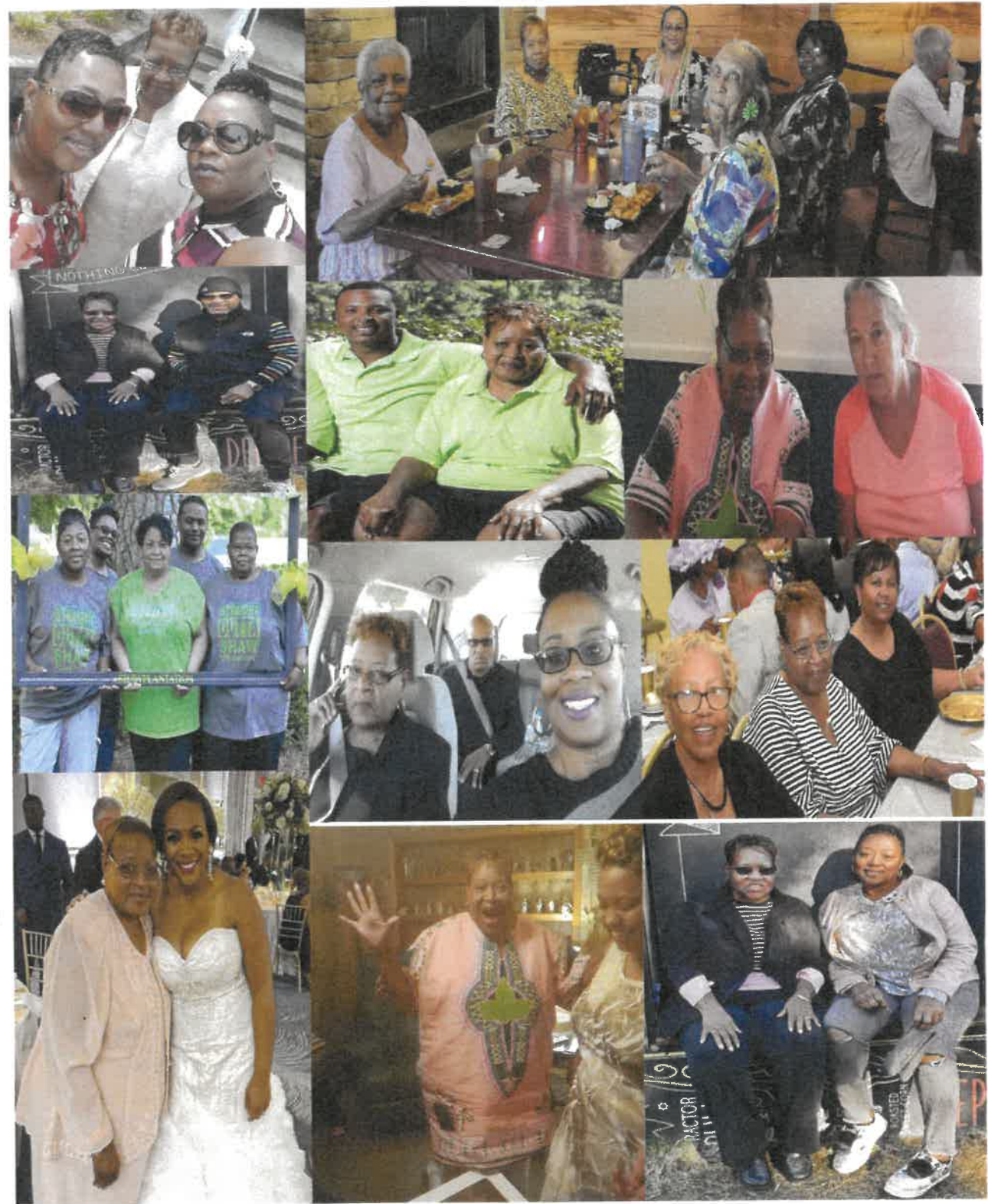

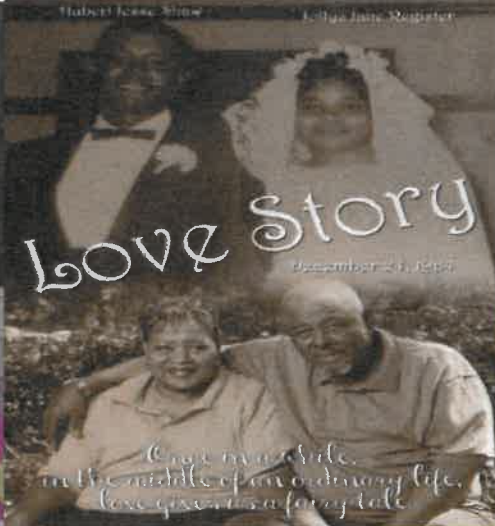
