**Evangelist Galloway** received her formal education and graduated from Tabor City High School. She also earned a degree in Early Childhood Development from Southeastern Community College. She worked at Jackson Memorial Hospital, Miami Florida as a Pediatric Nurse Assistant, and later various factory jobs.

At the age of 12 Evangelist Galloway accepted Christ as her personal savior; she was baptized and joined Zion Plain Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Reverend William H. David Flowers. She later moved to Jacksonville, Florida and joined Grace Holiness Church, while there she was a dedicated member.

**Evangelist Galloway** moved back home and married Willie Rudolph Galloway in 1958. To this union God blessed them with two daughters and a son, who was their pride and joy. Evangelist Galloway was devoted to her family. She instilled the value of faith in God and unity in them. She loved visiting the sick encouraging and praying for them.
