

Thomas Lewis Marley (Tom), the son of Douglas Leo Marley, Sr. (deceased) and Jessie Louise Glover Marley (deceased) was born August 4, 1940 in Whiteville, North Carolina. He transitioned into the loving eternal arms of the Creator on Monday, January 21, 2019, at Columbus Regional Hospital, Whiteville, NC. He was a graduate of Central High School class of 1959, in Whiteville, NC. Upon graduation, he enlisted in the United States Army in which he engaged in active duty for 2 years and National Guard for 4 years. He also attended Southeastern Community College acquiring various certifications and skill sets in brick masonry, welding, and electrician. 
