I'll be the voice that whispers in the breeze. I'm peaceful now, put your mind at ease.


I've rested my eyes and gone to sleep. But memories we've shared are yours to keep.



In Loving Memory of Nora Jacobs Nichols

Nora Jacobs Nichols was born October 16, 1928 and departed physical life on January 3, 2020 at her home at the age of 91.

Her younger years were devoted to being a mother who cared deeply for her children. She instilled hard work, Christian values and education as the foundation of their lives. This was done in similar fashion to her mother, Irene Jacobs. She played the piano at New Light Missionary Baptist Church since she was twelve years old and continued until 2010. At this time, she retired from active participation in church and community organizations, but she never retired in her heart.

As an underscore to her strong appreciation and love of education, one of her favorite hobbies was reading. Learning was a natural gift for Nora. As evidence, she matriculated through Farmers Union School and graduated valedictorian of her class at Artesia High School. She remained eager to learn and navigate new challenges throughout her lifetime. She attended Southeastern Community College and as her academic gifting dictated, she graduated with honors. To augment her educational experience, she participated in a North Carolina A & T University sponsored child nutrient management certification program. Truly, Nora's passions in life were serving God, serving the church, and education. She demonstrated a deep genuine desire to help guide the community through her participation in educational and religious endeavors. Nora held numerous offices at New Light Missionary Baptist Church and was a superb orator, mistress of ceremonies, and organizer of church events. Her multifaceted areas of church service ranged from homecoming celebration chairperson, Sunday school teacher, senior choir and male chorus musician, President of the Missionary Department and founder of the children's ministry. She was also the past President of the Brunswick Waccamaw Women's Home and Foreign Mission, which was a position once held by her mother. Nora also served as President of the Artesia High School Parent Teacher Association (PTA).

The leadership, mentorship, and passionate commitment unselfishly given was well respected by Nora's colleagues. She held membership in the Order of Eastern Star and Golden Circle as well as served as the Worthy Matron of the Shining Star #381 of Hallsboro. In additional past civic organization leadership capacities, she sat as the State District Deputy of District 17, Loyal Lady Ruler of the Allen Mingo Assembly #325 Order of the Golden Circle from 1979 through 1980, and was a dedicated member of the American Legion Auxiliary Post #233.

In 1999, she was one of four outstanding Columbus County residents honored during the 10th Community Banquet by the Tri-County Campaign of the United Negro College Fund. Nora retired in 1991 after twenty years of dedicated service to the State of North Carolina. She also worked as head start teacher at Artesia Elementary, Whiteville Edgewood Elementary School and the Columbus County Migrant School Program.

Nora Jacobs married Vangus T. Nichols and raised four boys: Vangus Winfort (deceased), George Linwood, Harold Alfonzo, and Virgil Bunn.

She is survived by three sons: George L. (Deborah) of Washington D.C., Harold A. (Gaynelle) of Gibsonville, North Carolina, and Virgil B. of Hallsboro, North Carolina, and was the tenth of thirteen siblings of the late Bunn and Irene Jacobs. (Benjamin, Annie Lee, Lillian, John Henry, Harden, Lula, Mable, Cora (twin), Joseph, Virginia, and George preceded her in death.) She is survived by her sister, Geraldine Jacobs Durham (Wade) of Dudley, North Carolina.

She touched the lives of many as she lived and worked according to that which was most important to her. As such, her life is one that touched every other life that she came in contact with. Nora J.
